As a child, Renie and her five siblings were raised by her parents, John and Bella Martin in a place called Ross River. Hunting for muskrat alongside her father, fishing and making dryfish with the catch of the day are some of the things that Renie remembers enjoying throughout her childhood. Renie lived in several different places growing up. She remembers her family and numerous other families travelling over the mountains with dogsleds on their way to Mayo. This was the first time she had ever seen a fish house. "I said, 'Ha! Look at that ragged

house!" she laughs at her naivety at the time, and from that point on, she was teased by her uncle whenever they saw a fish house.

Renie and her family would often stay with her uncle, trapping muskrat and fishing throughout the spring. When Renie was 10-yearsold she remembers going to school for the very first time with her sister. After spending 8 years in Mayo, Renie and her siblings went to live with their mother.

Over the years, Renie has had many different job opportunities. She remembers working for Semmelers as a clerk and taking care of all the bookkeeping. She also remembers working for a sewing centre where she would make parkas. Renie would even sew at home, "I worked there for a long time," she says, "Making parkas, that's what I did!"
